 Council Bill <u>13-2010</u> – An Ordinance concerning administrative enforcement and making conforming amendments to Article V of Chapter 2 of the Wheat Ridge Code of Laws.

Motion by Mr. DeMott to approve Council Bill 14-2010 on first reading, order it published, public hearing set for Monday, August 9, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers, and that it take effect 15 days after final publication; seconded by Mrs. Sang; carried 7-0.

3. Council Bill <u>15-2010</u> – amending Article I of Chapter 26 concerning the provision for Conditions of Approval in the Zone Change Process.

Council Bill 15-2010 was introduced on first reading by Mrs. Langworthy.

Motion by Mrs. Langworthy to approve Council Bill 15-2010 on first reading, order it published, public hearing set for Monday, August 23, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers, and that it take effect 15 days after final publication; seconded by Mr. Reinhart; carried 7-0.

5. Motion to approve the closure of 38th Avenue from Sheridan Boulevard to Wadsworth Boulevard and approving placement of Banners and Signs in Street Rights-of-Way for the Wheat Ridge Carnation Festival.

<u>Motion</u> by Mr. Stites to approve closure of 38th Avenue on August 21, 2010 for the Carnation Festival Parade. I further move to approve the placement of Carnation Festival Banners in the City Street Rights-of-Way; seconded by Mr. Reinhart; carried 7-0.

ELECTED OFFICIALS' MATTERS

City Clerk Michael Snow informed Wheat Ridge Voters of the upcoming Primary Election, which is a Mail Ballot Election. Ballots have been mailed to registered voters. There will be no polling places on Election Day. City Clerk's Office has a Ballot drop box.

Mayor DiTullio read a statement regarding a criminal case into the record.

Mrs. Adams informed citizens of the upcoming Citizens' Academy which starts on September 7.

Mr. Stites asked businesses to clean up their parking lots prior to the parade and take care of the weeds.

Mrs. Jay and Mayor DiTullio mentioned that the Town Meeting will take place this Thursday, July 29th, 2010 at 7pm at WRRC to discuss Trash and Recycling Services and other pertinent City issues. Interested citizens are encouraged to attend.
